## SHOW RULES

1. The show is a society only show and may only be entered by current members of the Bristol Fuchsia & Geranium Society
2. You must send entries to the Show Organiser by Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> July. You may also e-mail entries to [john.nicholass@btinternet.com](mailto:john.nicholass@btinternet.com) or phone them in up to 9:30pm on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> July.
3. All plants must be pot grown by the exhibitor or have been in their possession for at least 60 days prior to the show.
4. Staging will take place between 8:00pm & 10:00pm on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July and between 8:00am & 10:00am on Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> July.
5. Place the exhibitor cards from the Show Organiser by each entry face down.
6. You may not remove plants from the show before 4:30pm without special permission from the Show Organiser.
7. The Judges decision is final on all matters relating to the judging.
8. The show committee will decide any matters not provided for in these rules.
9. No exhibitor (except those given special tasks by the Show Organiser) is allowed in the hall while Judging is taking place.
10. No square pots will be allowed. Plastic pots will have size shown on the bottom either in inches or mm. Crock pots will be measured across the inside of the rim. All pots, except hanging pots, must be of terracotta colour. Pots must be in proportion, i.e. growers pots not allowed.
11. All plants shall be grown as a bush or shrub except otherwise stated. Bush plants are grown on one stem max 1½" long. Shrub may be one or more plants (multiplant).
12. Semi-Double flowered plants should only be exhibited in the single flowered or "any cultivar" classes.
13. Only society stands will be allowed for basket classes. No ornamental stands or pots shall used by any exhibitor to display plants in any class (except in the Novelty and Table decoration classes).
14. The **HIGHEST** place card only in any one class will go forward to the points trophy where one exhibitor has more than one prize card in that class.
15. In the event of a tie on points, the number of first prizes, then second prizes, then third prizes will be used to decide the winner.
16. Each trophy or salver shall be held for one year. Trophies may be engraved at the exhibitor's expense. The winner will ensure it is returned at the next years show in a clean condition.
17. Children's classes (29 & 30) are open to children less than 16 years old.

## **INFORMATION**

1. A BEGINNER is a person who has not won two first prizes at any of our fuchsia shows, excluding the bloom board, table decoration, floating heads, corsage, & novelty classes.
  2. A SINGLE bloom has up to FOUR petals per bloom.
  3. A SEMI-DOUBLE bloom has between FIVE and SEVEN petals per bloom.
  4. A DOUBLE bloom has EIGHT or more petals per bloom.
- BASKETS.**
5. Full Baskets must be commercially manufactured. The top must be circular in shape and not exceed 16" in diameter. The maximum depth allowed is 9".
  6. Half Baskets must be commercially manufactured. The top must be semi-circular in shape and not exceed 16" in diameter. The maximum depth allowed is 9". N.B. baskets may have flat bottoms, solid bases and straight sides. Stands for the basket classes (including mini-baskets) are provided by the Society. The use of a framework to increase the overall height of a half basket is NOT allowed.
  7. Class 21 - Leaves to have a distinct colour(s). Green leaves or reddish bronze triphyllas are not eligible.
  8. Class 9 – Plants revert to being "Triphylla type".
  9. The Society cannot accept responsibility for the safe keeping of exhibits.
  10. The Show Organiser will have the right to remove from the show any plant in the entire show that is affected by Rust, Red Spider etc. to protect from spreading to other Show Plants.

## **AWARDS**

1. The PRESIDENTS TROPHY and will be awarded to 'Best plant or best exhibit in the show'.
2. The GEOFF BARNETT TROPHY will be awarded to the 'Runner up to the best plant or exhibit in the show'.
3. The DAPAMIA SHIELD will be awarded to the person having the 'Highest number of points in the show'.
4. The winner of the Championship Class 19 will receive a British Fuchsia Society Bronze medal.
5. The winner of Beginners Class 23 will be awarded the STAN MORGAN MEMORIAL SALVER and a British Fuchsia Society Silver spoon.
6. THE BRITISH SOCIETY BLUE ROSETTE will be awarded at the Judges Discretion.
